APPLICATION FOR BACHELOR HEALTH SCIENCES: HOMOEOPATHY – 2016 INTAKE

Thank you for your application for the above programme. In order to proceed to the next level of selection you are requested to book and attend an interview and write assessment tests at the Durban University of Technology, Ritson Campus. Please complete the following documents and bring them to the interview:

1. The attached assignment. Please bring the completed assignment in your own handwriting to the interview.
2. Your latest marks if you are currently in grade 12 or at any other place of study.
3. Two recent passport photographs of yourself and 2 certified copies of the first page of your identity document.

For your convenience the interviews will be held in the morning starting at 08h30 and the tests will be held straight after the interviews on the same day. The tests will start at about 10h45 and finish round about 16h00. Please plan on being with us for the whole day. The interviews and tests will be held on the following dates:

Saturday, 14 November 2015; Thursday, 19 November 2015 and Saturday, 21 November 2015. Students who come late in November may only know the decision in January 2016 as we have to submit our final lists by the 10 November 2015.

Please contact our departmental secretary, Mrs G Clarke, on (031) 373 2514, email gilliancl@dut.ac.za or fax 0866740451 as soon as possible to book your test and interview between 09h30 and 16h30 on weekdays. The office is not open over weekends. When you book your interview please state the date you wish to come for your interview, then your name followed by your CAO reference number and ID number. You only need to attend on one of the above dates. You are requested to complete the selection process early so that you can plan your next year of study. Unsuccessful applicants will then still be able to apply for an alternate course of study.

Applicants are to note that Durban University of Technology will not take responsibility for any costs incurred in attending the interview. **The venue is the Homoeopathy department (upstairs at the back end of the building- marked "Block L" on the map). Enter via Gate 6, Steve Biko Road, of Durban University of Technology, Ritson Campus. Attached is a map for directions to the interview venue. There will be arrows on the walls directing you to the venue or alternatively you can ask the Security Guard on duty for directions.**

The final student selections will be made after the results of the interviews and tests are known. The decision of the selection committee will be final and will be conveyed to you within 2 to 3 weeks of the interview via CAO (Central Applications Office). Successful applicants will be sent their acceptance packs by the end of November from the Student Admissions Department of Durban University of Technology. It is your responsibility to keep all documents in a safe place.

Final decisions for 2016 applicants have to be submitted in November to allow successful applicants receive their acceptance packs sent by the Student Admissions department detailing their student number, registration details and other useful information. Successful candidates will be required to lodge a non-refundable deposit of R500.00 to reserve their place within 1 to 2 weeks of receiving their acceptance pack. This deposit will be credited towards the first instalment of the 2016 tuition fees. Failure to pay this deposit may result in this position being offered to the next candidate on the list should the course be oversubscribed. We can only register 35 first year students per year. The first instalment of the tuition fee of approximately R4000 is payable on registration. Students may deduct their deposit from this amount. Students will have to bring proof of all payments to registration.

Due to the high demand for funding and residence students are advised to return their acceptance slips with deposits as soon as possible and to apply for NSFAS funding (closing date: 30 November 2015) and residence as the whole of DUT and NSFAS offices usually close in the second week in December and open just before registration round. Homoeopathy will register students on 19 January 2016. Lectures start round about the 25 January with other activities taking place the week before.
