

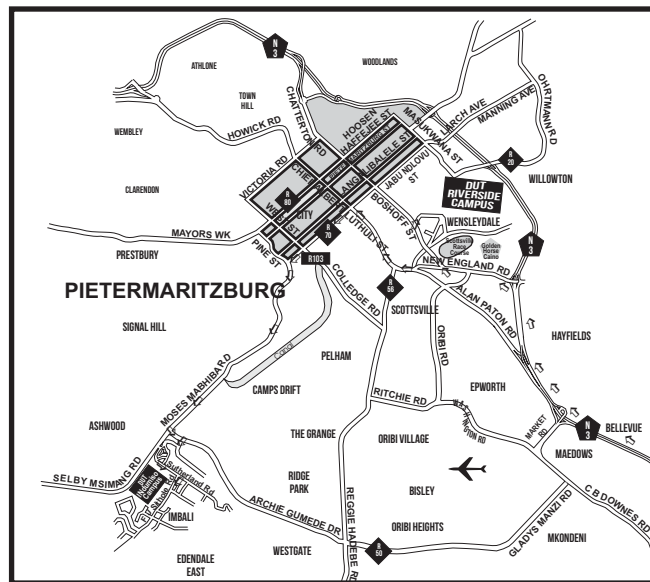

### Riverside Campus:

*19 Aberfeldy Road, Scottsville, Pietermaritzburg.*

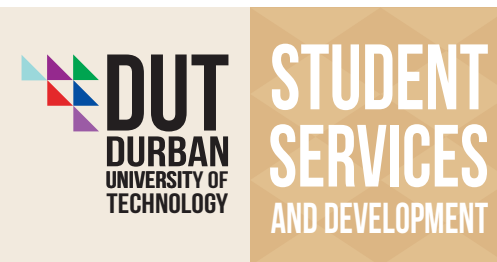
Take N3 from Durban Take New England Road Turn off. Turn right into Boshoff Street and then right into 19 Aberfeldy Road

### Indumiso Campus:

*F J Sithole Road, Pietermaritzburg.*

Take N3 from Durban then take New England Road turn off. Continue straight and turn left into Jabu Ndlovu Street. Come to 'T' junction and then turn left into Moses Mabhida Road. Turn left into Archie Gumede Drive - first right and first left. Come to 'T' Junction turn left Into Sutherland Road and then right into F J Sithole Road.
